Robert Kimberly to Speak at April 24th Meeting

Join the FTxR on April 24th, 2023, at 7:00 pm for "An Evening with Digital Sig Byrd Archivist Robert Kimberly." Through our Zoom meeting platform (link provided below), FTxR President Mr. McKinney will interview our guest on the Digital Sig Byrd Archive, an online repository of *Houston Press* columns by Sigman Byrd, the mid-century chronicler of a Houston long gone. Kimberly, who started the archive in 2007, will take us on a journey through his research aided by the HMRC collection.

Currently, Kimberly serves as the Installations Manager for the Blaffer Art Museum at the University of Houston and has worked for some of Houston's most important arts institutions, including the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston; the Houston Center for Photography; and the Rice University Art Gallery.



The Digital Sig Byrd Archive is ongoing project that works to preserve Byrd's daily columns from October 1947 through mid-1950s. Sig Byrd The site offers an introduction to his writings and provides names, places, maps, and calendars to offer a broad overview of his writings during his time at the *Houston Press*.

Byrd's writings from 1947 through mid-1950s leave behind a distinctive portrait of Houston's upstanding citizens as well as those who lived on the fringe of the city's respectable society including junkies, hookers, hustlers, street-corner preachers, pawnshop owners, honky-tonk angels, boogie-woogie boys, dealers, and more. Because these stories are often not shared, Monday's program will be a rare treat for FTxR members and guests.

Collection News

The HHRC has accepted several additions to MSS 0496 Graham B. Luhn Papers and MSS 1421 the Chase Untermeyer collection.

New book collection acquisitions include the following:

Cecelia Ottenweller donated a copy of her book about the Houston zoo, written in celebration of their centennial.

Cynthia Stubblefield Walker brought by copies of the Montgomery County Historical Commission's History Taskforce Publication *African American cemeteries in Montgomery County, Texas.* The publication of this book was covered on the front page of the Chronicle on Wed 2/22.

Friends of the Texas Room gave us two new books by Houston historian Barrie Scardino Bradley.

FRIENDS OF THE TEXAS ROOM POLICIES

The FTxR policies relate to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library.

A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library, will not buy expendable supplies for the Library, or fund Library personnel.

B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

This is a call for entries for the annual Julia Ideson Award sponsored by the Friends of the Texas Room at the Houston Public Library. The award commemorates the Houston Public Library's first director, Julia Bedford Ideson (1885-1945), and it recognizes distinguished projects that document Houston and Texas history and culture.

The 2023 award category is for a scholarly and researched film or video presentation, website, published article, monograph, master's thesis, or doctoral

dissertation. The category of published books (excluding doctoral dissertations) will be accepted in 2024.

Entries: The 2023 award category is for a scholarly and researched film or video presentation, website, published article, monograph, master's thesis, or doctoral dissertation completed within the last five years (2017 – 2023) documenting local Houston and/or Texas history and culture using the resources of the Houston Metropolitan Research Center significantly, but not necessarily exclusively. The category of published books (excluding doctoral dissertations) will be accepted in 2024.

The Julia Ideson Award and a prize of \$500.00 will be presented to the winner by the Friends of the Texas Room at its annual meeting on October 2023.

- 1. Name, address, telephone number, and e-mail of the person submitting the entry/nomination.
- 2. Name, address, telephone number, and e-mail of the person(s) or organization responsible for the project, if not the nominator.
- 3. Brief description of the entry.
- 4. LIST OF THE SPECIFIC RESOURCES OF THE TEXAS ROOM / HMRC USED IN THE PROJECT AND BRIEF STATEMENT OF HOW SUCH RESOURCES WERE UTILIZED.
- 5. Explanation of how the project contributes to a better understanding of local or Texas history/culture.
- 6. Three copies of the entry.

Submission:

Entries must be submitted in the name of the person(s) or organization responsible for executing the project. Submitting an entry constitutes agreement to the terms of eligibility and also serves as agreement that the Friends of the Texas Room may publicize the award and accompanying details about the recipient(s). All physical entries become the property of the Houston Metropolitan Research Center.
