his website, Mr. Abboud presents sections on the history of Houston's department stores, electronics stores, furniture stores, grocery stores, restaurants, and malls. He also includes a "Retail Museum"

where viewers may explore matchbooks, ashtrays, badges, buttons, name tags, and pins related to Houston's retail history. ## MINUTES OF THE JULY 25th, 2022, ANNUAL MEETING

President Mister McKinney called the October 24th, 2023, Annual Meeting to order at 7:00 pm. He began the evening's business by introducing the 2022 FTxR officers and directors and thanking them for their time, expertise, and passion for supporting the Friends of the Texas Room.

After highlighting some of the FTxR projects and contributions for the Houston Metropolitan Research Center, he asked that the Minutes of the July 25th General Meeting (printed in the *Texas Room Dispatch*) be read and approved. Members voted to accept the Minutes by unanimous consent, and the motion to accept the Minutes was seconded and recorded.

Next, Mister McKinney introduced the evening's speaker Jeff Lindemann. In a presentation entitled "From Bremen to Houston: Mid-Nineteenth Century German Emigration to Texas. Lindemann, a fifth-generation German-Texan, wove a tale of two journeys: that of his ancestors' journey forward through their time to Houston and his own journey back through time to Breman. A retired college English professor of 43 years, Lindemann shared his experiences exploring research centers in Texas and Germany, travelling through communist East Germany in 1987 in search of Lindemann family records, and in writing, compiling, and publishing his family history book *The Lindemann Family History: Three Generations in Texas.* He donated copies to the Clayton Branch Library in Houston and to the Lutheran Church in the village of Worpen, Germany.

#### Rare Books Room Showcase – 2/16/23 at 5:45 PM in the Texas Room



## FRIENDS OF THE TEXAS ROOM POLICIES

The FTxR policies relate to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library.

#### A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library, will not buy expendable supplies for the Library, or fund Library personnel.

#### B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

#### Deadline: May 1,2023

This is a call for entries for the annual Julia Ideson Award sponsored by the Friends of the Texas Room at the Houston Public Library. The award commemorates the Houston Public Library's first director, Julia Bedford Ideson (1885-1945), and it recognizes distinguished projects that document Houston and Texas history and culture.

#### THE RESOURCES OF THE LIBRARY'S TEXAS ROOM/HOUSTON METROPOLITAN RESEARCH CENTER <u>MUST</u> BE USED, TO A SIGNIFICANT EXTENT, IN THE CREATION OF THE ENTRY.

In 2023, the call for entries is for published books documenting Houston and Texas history and culture.

The Julia Ideson Award and a prize of \$500.00 will be presented to the winner by the Friends of the Texas Room at its annual meeting on October 2023. Eligibility: A book based scholarly research completed within the past five years (2017-2022) documenting local Houston and/or Texas history and culture USING THE RESOURCES OF THE HOUSTON METROPOLITAN RESEARCH CENTER SIGNIFICANTLY, BUT NOT NECESSARILY EXCLUSIVELY.

2023 Entries: As described above.

# THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH EACH ENTRY:

1. Name, address, telephone number and e-mail of the person submitting the entry/nomination.

2. Name, address, telephone number and e-mail of the person(s) or organization responsible for the project, if not the nominator.

3. Briefly describe the entry.

4. LIST THE SPECIFIC RESOURCES OF THE TEXAS ROOM / HMRC USED IN THE PROJECT AND HOW SUCH RESOURCES WERE UTILIZED.

5. Explain how the project contributes to a better understanding of local or Texas history/culture.

6. Submit **three copies** of the entry.

#### Submission:

Entries must be submitted in the name of the person(s) or organization responsible for executing the project. Submitting an entry constitutes agreement to the terms of eligibility and also serves as agreement that the Friends of the Texas Room may publicize the award and accompanying details about the recipient(s). All physical entries become the property of the Houston Metropolitan Research Center.
