As the new year begins, we welcome the new manager of the HMRC, Kemo Curry, who assumed the position effective November 17th, 2007. Most recently she has been Acting Manager of the John P. McGovern-Stella Link Neighborhood Library.

Ms. Curry, who holds a Masters in Library Science, joined the Houston Public Library in 1997 as the Supervisor of the Access Center for the Visually and Hearing Impaired. She has worked in many different areas of the HPL system including as Fiction Specialist and Assistant Manager of the Humanities. She and her colleague, Michael Van Campen, planned and initiated the HPL's original virtual reference service Info Live! She also created the Reader's Connect pages on the HPL website.

Prior to joining the HPL, she served as Curator of Print Storage at the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston; curator of Dr. Mavis P. Kelsey's private art collection of Winslow Homer engravings; and Curator of Exhibits for the Menil Foundation.

HISTORIAN DR. JOHN B. BOLES TO SPEAK AT JANUARY 28 MEETING

The speaker for our January 28th meeting is Dr. John B. Boles, William P. Hobby Professor of History at Rice University and Editor of the *Journal of Southern History*. His research areas are U. S. Southern history, with emphasis on religion, culture, and slavery. His topic for our meeting is "Thomas Jefferson."

MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 22, 2007, GENERAL MEETING

The Friends of the Texas Room met at 7 P.M., 2007, at the Museum of Printing History. After an opening reception, initially cloaked in darkness because of an area blackout, the fall meeting of the Friends of the Texas Room began at 7:00 P.M. The minutes of the July 23 meeting were approved, and the treasurer's report will be filed with the secretary.

Sims McCutchan announced that the information about the Friends of the Texas Room's Julia Ideson Award was being distributed. This annual award will be given for a project completed in the last five years that drew in part on research done in the Houston Metropolitan Research Center. He also noted that we are seeking volunteers to begin next January to inventory the Texas Room collection, work Sims, Anne Sloan, and Betty Chapman have started. The volunteers would receive training from the Library staff.

Our website, www.friendsofthetexasroom.org is up and running.

The Julia Ideson Library Preservation Partners have begun their efforts to raise funds for the extension that would house the Library archives. Thirty million dollars is needed before the work can begin.

Jim Parsons presented an illustrated presentation on Art Deco in Houston, based on *Houston Deco*, a book on which he and David Bush have collaborated. He said that to their surprise they found many more Art Deco buildings in Houston than they had expected, and 140 appear in their book. The style came late to Houston and in moderated form. He highlighted the work of Albert C. Finn and Joseph Finger and cited Finn's Gulf Bank Building as one of the prime examples of Houston's Art Deco architecture.

Dorothy Knox Houghton thanked Jim Parsons for his splendid talk and Ann Becker and her committee for making the reception so convivial.

The meeting adjourned at 8:15 P.M.

POLICIES

Policies of the Friends of the Texas Room

Relating to The Houston Metropolitan Research Center which includes the Collections of the Archives and Manuscripts Department, the Texas and Local History Department, and the Special Collections Department of the Houston Public Library

A. Contributions

From time to time, the Friends of the Texas Room will purchase and contribute to the Houston Metropolitan Research Center of the Houston Public Library items that will enrich and enhance the above-named collections and ensure their preservation.

All such contributions will be purchased by the Friends directly and then given to the Library with specific stipulations as to how such contributions are to be used by the Library to enhance and ensure the preservation of the HMRC collections.

The Friends will give no money directly to the Library.

The Friends will not buy expendable supplies for the Library.

The Friends will not fund Library personnel.

B. Relationship to Administration and Staff

The Friends of the Texas Room is not to be involved in the administrative or employee actions of the Center, except that the Friends can question policies which, in its opinion, negatively impact the ability of the Center to provide service to the public.

CULTURAL MATCHING GIFTS

Are you or your spouse working for or retired from a corporation which makes cultural matching grants or volunteer involvement awards if you give to or do volunteer work for a cultural institution?

Will your employer match your gifts to cultural institutions that qualify under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code?

The Friends of the Texas Room has such a qualification. Send your corporation's cultural matching funds form with your check for membership in FTR. If you volunteer your time as an officer of FTR or in the Texas Room or HMRC, keep track of your hours and turn them in to your corporation so that the FTR may obtain a grant from your corporation's program. This is "found money" for FTR and can be used towards making a difference to the Texas Room and HMRC.
